

Cromdale Addresses

Note: The main sources for this document were voter's lists from 1957 and 1963, the Henderson's Directories for 1908 to 1970, and the *Edmonton Bulletin* and *Edmonton Journal* newspapers. Street numbers rise as you move south to north. Avenue numbers rise as you move east to west. The structures listed in this document may or may not still exist. The number of residential homes probably peaked in roughly 1950; since then, roughly 150 residences were demolished to allow building higher density structures or to make room for business developments. Most of the demolished homes were either on the west side of 82nd Street to 84th Street between Jasper Avenue and 111th Avenue or they were between 112th Avenue and the LRT tracks from 79th Street to 82nd Street.

This was a grades 1-8 school until sometime between 1961 and 1964 when it became a grades 1-6 school, presumably due to decreased enrolment. By the late fifties and perhaps earlier, two grades would be taught in one classroom. Students who did grades 1-6 at Cromdale then went to Highlands Junior High for grades 7-9. Prior to that, students who did grades 1-8 at Cromdale only did grade 9 at Highlands, assuming they continued living in the east end.

83rd Street (south of 111th Avenue)

In 1957, the following were living there: Mitchell Nelson, barber, Mrs. Mitchell Nelson, Henry Lockhart, draftsman, and Mrs. Henry Lockhart.

Mary Hall was still living at that address in 1963 and was recorded as retired.

From 1920 to 1927, this was inhabited by Walter Collingwood. In 1930, Walter Collingwood was living there. In 1950, T. M. Collingwood was living there. Mr. and Mrs. T. M. Collingwood, retired, lived there in 1957. Martin and Catherine Collingwood, retired, lived there in 1963.

11012-83rd Street – Residence

In 1950 Carl Gunderson and Clement Schroeder were living there. Carl Gunderson retired lived there in 1957.

11015-83rd Street – Residence

In 1930, William Worton was living there. In 1950, William Worton was living there. In 1957 and 1963, William Worton, janitor, and his wife Fannie were living there.

11015-83rd Street – Residence

In 1957, William Worton janitor and Mrs. William Worton were living there.

11018-83rd Street – Residence

In 1950, Benjamin J. Shalin was living there. In 1957, Peter Schurman and his wife were living there. In 1963, Karl Neubauer, labourer, and Mary Neubauer were living there.

11019-83rd Street – Residence

In 1950, R. G. Christensen was living there. In 1957, the following were living there: Mrs. Annie Padlewski widow, Miss Mary Padlewski, civil servant, and Mike Shram office V.T.C. In 1963, Mrs. Ann Padlewski was living there with Walter Curtis, teacher, and Ann Curtis, secretary.

11022-83rd Street – Residence

G. Stanley Long was living there from 1920 to 1927. In 1930, John L. Muir was living there. There is no entry for anyone living there in the Henderson Directory for 1950. In 1957, the following were living there: John Kushnir carpenter, Mrs. John Kushnir, and Miss Lena Kushnir, clerk. In 1963, the following were living there: Alex Mammczur meat packer and Mrs. Olga Mammczur.

11023-83rd Street – Residence

In 1940, Eldon Reid, clerk at Safeway, lived there. As well, Eldon's father, Earl Albert Reid was living there in 1940. In 1957, Mr. T. Edgar Arbuthnot, office manager was living there with his wife. In 1963, Edgar Arbuthnot, credit manager, was living there with Willis Arbuthnot. In the *Edmonton Journal*, Thomas Edgar Arbuthnot was recorded as having died in 1975. He was born on 1 May 1898 in York, Ontario, Canada. His parents were Thomas Arbuthnot (1868-1940) and Ada Elizabeth Dawkins (1866 -).

11026-83rd Street – Residence

From 1920 to 1927, George A. Charlesworth lived there. In 1930, George A. Charlesworth was living there. In 1957, Mrs. Alice Livingstone, widow, was living there. There were no voters living there in 1963.

11027 – 83rd Street – Residence

Fred Klatt was living there from 1920 to 1927. In 1930, Frederick Klatt lived there. Fred Klatt was born on 29 March 1881 in Poland and died on 21 August 1954 in Edmonton. He was married to Louisa Kuball who was born on 30 November 1888 in Germany and died on 27 Feb 1977 in Edmonton. There is no

record for this address in the Henderson's Directory for 1950. In 1957, Watson Gowers lived there with his wife, Sophie. There is no record of voters living in the house in 1963. This was a one-story home. Mr. Gowers and his wife maintained a rock garden with miniature structures such as houses and a bridge in their yard. Mr. Gowers may have been formerly in the military as he was a commissionaire.

11028-83rd Street – Residence

Alex Entwistle was living there from 1920 to 1922. Alex Entwistle was a noted theatre impresario in Edmonton. In 1923 and 1924, Oscar D'Unieux was living there. In 1925, Renwick Taylor was living there. In 1926, John Doyle was living there. In 1927, Joseph J. Doyle was living there. In 1930, M. E. Murray was living there. In 1957, the following were living there: Mrs. Rosa Miller widow and William Kinker Swift Canada employee. In 1963, Anna Himer housekeeper lived there.

11029-83rd Street – Residence

In 1920, Arthur Metz was living there. In 1921 and 1922 Henry Gregson lived there. It was listed as vacant in 1923. In 1924, John Rasmussen lived there. Otto Klatt lived there in 1925. In 1926, O. Gordon was recorded as living there. In 1927, Walter Allen was living there. In 1930, Walter Erwied was living there. In 1950, William Stetsko was living there. In 1957, Roy Clifford Anderson, shipper, was living there with Regina Anderson. The same couple were living there in 1963. Roy Clifford Anderson was born on 29 November 1936 in Drumheller and died on 19 September 2007 in Edmonton.

11034 – 83rd Street – Residence

In 1920 and 1921, this was inhabited by H. E. Merrick. From 1922 to 1927, it was inhabited by Fred J. Mitchell. In 1930, Fred J. Mitchell lived there. In 1950, Gordon Herbert Rennie lived here with his family. Mr. Rennie worked with the Department of Veterans Affairs in 1950. Mr. Rennie was born in 1912 in England and passed away in 2010. He was married to Ivy. Mr. Rennie was a member of the Gyro club in Edmonton for 60 years. As of 1957, a veterinarian named Bronislavas Vidugiris (20 Oct 1914-26 May 2012) lived in the house here with Mrs. Vidugiris and their son. Their son attended a Catholic school. They moved to Hamilton, Ontario, prior to 1963. In 1963, the house was inhabited by Harry Sanachan, mechanic, and his wife Elaine. It was a relatively large house and the outside was painted white. This home had a veranda in front. This house and 11038 were demolished in 1965 to make way for a low-rise apartment building.

11034-83rd St. – Low-Rise Apartment Building

In 1965, a 10-unit apartment building was built at this address.

11037-83rd Street – Residence

In 1930, W. J. Brunless lived there. In 1950, R. M. Cherry lived there. In 1957, Russell Cherry, shipper, was living there. In 1963, Russell Cherry was still living there but was retired. A Russell Maurice Cherry is recorded as having died on 17 January 1967 in the *Edmonton Journal*. This is likely the same person.

11038 – 83rd Street – Residence

William Parris was living there from 1920 to 1924. In 1925, Ernest Smalian lived there. Ernest Smalian was born on 14 May 1873 in Buckingham, Quebec and died on 9 July 1961 in Edmonton. He was married to Margaret Evelyn Freathy (1894-1945). In 1926, Mr. Stenton lived there. In 1927, Douglas McNichol lived there. In 1930, Albert A. Hill was living there. In 1950, Eunice Hill was living there. In 1957, Miss Maud Van Iderstone Deverell, homemaker, lived there with Mrs. A. A. Hill, widow. Maud Van Iderstone Deverell was born on 31 March 1876, in Marquette, Marquette County, Michigan, USA and died on 19

July 1964 (age 88). This was quite a small, single-storey home with a large garden in the back where they grew dill, among other things.

11044 – 83rd Street – Residence

In 1916, the following were living in the house as per the Canadian Census: John Coyne, Alfred F. Coyne, Bessie Coyne and Abele Coyne. In 1920 and 1921, the home was occupied by Delos Wismer. Delos Wismer was born 9 May 1880 in Lincoln County, Ontario. His parents were Abraham Wismer and Susannah Grobb. Bessie Coyne inhabited the house from 1922 to 1926. In 1930, Bessie Coyne was living there. Bessie was born in about 1889 in Turkey and immigrated to Canada in 1905 because she was avoiding an arranged marriage. In 1927, the home was inhabited by Elisha Kennedy. As of 1957, the home was inhabited by Abele (Ab) Coyne and his wife Audrey Coyne. Ab Coyne's father was Alfred F. Coyne, who was born in Scotland in about 1889 and immigrated to Canada in 1905. Alfred Coyne worked in the financial services industry. As of 1963, Ab and Audrey still lived there. The home was demolished in 1967 to make way for a walk-up apartment. This was a modest single-storey home. Mr. Coyne was a businessman of some note and came eventually to be owner of Coyne Yamaha Piano in Edmonton, among other business interests. Ab's second wife was Margaret Gow, who died in 1985 of cancer. Ab was born in about 1912 in Edmonton and died in about 2005 in Edmonton. Ab purchased the Shaw mansion in 1966, thus he no longer needed the house in Cromdale.

11045-83rd Street – Residence

In 1920, this house was vacant. In 1921, Miss Eva Wade was listed as a teacher at McCauley School in Edmonton. In 1947, when the Skutles moved in next door, Eva Wade was a former school teacher and spinster and she occupied the house. She married Alexander Howard McIntyre at some point and he is recorded as living at this address in 1950. In 1957, Mr. Alexander Howard McIntyre, retired, was married to Eva and living at that address. The same couple, Howard and Eva McIntyre, were living there in 1963. Alexander Howard McIntyre was born in 1883 in Middleville, Ontario, Canada. Eva was his second wife. His first wife was named Lena. He may have had a son named Archie. This home was demolished in the mid-sixties to make way for a low-rise apartment building.

11046 – 83rd Street – Residence

This house was built in 1913 for Peter and Henrietta Mackay. Peter Sutherland Mackay lived there until he died in 1920 at age 46. Peter was born in Woodstock, Ontario in 1873. Henrietta (McLuhan) Mackay was born in 1884 in Mount Forest, Ontario. Henrietta lived there until her death in 1950 in Edmonton. Reta came with her family to Alberta in 1906 and they farmed near Mannville, Alberta for some time before moving into Edmonton where she met Peter. In 1930, Reta Mackay lived in this house. After her death in 1950, the house was inhabited until 1967 by Douglas (1914-1993) and Mary (Caddy) Mackay (1917-2000) and their children. Douglas Mackay was an engineer at Chemcell on refinery row. Doug was involved with the YMCA in Edmonton and coordinated the daffodil campaign on certain occasions. The house was demolished in the fall of 1967 to make way for a walk-up apartment. The house had an enclosed porch in the front. It had a two-car garage, added in roughly 1960. There was a wood-burning fireplace in the study. There were two bedrooms on the main floor and one in the basement, which had been rented out when Rita lived there. The basement was otherwise not finished. The main floor had wooden floors. There was a gas fireplace in the front room. There was wood panelling on the walls in the dining room and study. There were built-in wooden shelves in the study.

11047 – 83rd Street – Residence

In 1920, this house was inhabited by Harry Johnston. In 1921-22, it was inhabited by John W. Dowell. In 1923, it was inhabited by Fred J. Wall. From 1924 to 1927, it was inhabited by Robert Raitt. In 1930, it

was inhabited by Robert Raitt. The Skutle family moved into this house in 1947. Immediately prior to that time, it was owned by Clifford Kirkpatrick, retired CN station agent from Wabamun. Robert Clifford Kirkpatrick (who went by "Kirk") was born on 4 May 1874 in Debec, New Brunswick. He was married to Cynthia Davis. The following is taken from: http://www.geocities.ws/g_bufflehead/wabamun2.html "In the summer of 1913, Robert Clifford Kirkpatrick was appointed station agent [in Wabamun]; a position he held for more than thirty years. His wife Cynthia, children Robert and Catherine arrived from New Brunswick in August to take up residence. The station was a very busy place with passengers, mail, telegrams, express freight and settler's effects which arrived daily by the carload for points north, south east and west." Gordon Skutle was also originally from Wabamun. This was a two-storey house, painted white on the outside. It was enclosed by a low white picket fence. In 1957, it was inhabited by Gordon Skutle and his wife, Dorie, along with their four children. It was inhabited by the same family in 1963. The home was greatly improved by the Skutles, including a rumpus room in the basement and extensive renovations to the second floor. The Skutles moved out in the mid-sixties and the house was demolished to make way for a low-rise apartment. Gordon Skutle worked as an engineer at CICA radio from 1943 to 1986. He made a scrapbook with his pictures and various articles. This scrapbook can be seen at: <http://www.infoese.ca/skutle.html>.

84th Street (south of 111th Avenue)

Note: Before 1914, 84th Street was Harvey Street from 101st Avenue to 112th Avenue and Bolton Street from 112th Avenue to the City Limits.

10911-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, Gordon Foster was living here. In 1957, James Jack, retired, lived there with Mrs. James Jack. There is a record of a James Jack born in Scotland in 1881, immigrated to Canada in 1908 and recorded in the Canadian Census in Alberta in 1916.

10931-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, the following lived there: Nick Pelle and Nels Mdelung. In 1957, the following lived there: J. A. Jacobson, tractor driver, Mrs. E. Snow, widow, Miss Amy Snow, day worker. The following lived there in 1963: Walter Kalinowsky who was retired, Mrs. A. Kalinowsky, and Celestien Sucherowsky, librarian, Irene Sucherowsky, Dmitro Yaremchuk, clerk. In 1963, the following were living there: Darrel Schinzel, salesman, Mrs. Monica Schinzel, Julia Rosychuk Department of National Defence.

10935-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, George Oake lived there.

10935-84th Street – Low-rise Apartment Building

As of 1957, it appears on the voters list with five units occupied. The owner is listed in 1957 as Mr. A. J. Hosegood. Arthur John Hosegood was born on 19 January 1892 in Wellington, Somerset, England and died in Edmonton on 7 June 1970. He was married to Elsie Constance Shannon (b. 1895). The following lived there in 1963: Mike Panas, bartender, Mrs. Nancy Panas, Roger Chapdelaine, tire repair, and Miss Audrey McFadyen, typist.

10951-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, Chris R. Shaw lived there.

10955-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, Theo Christianson lived there.

10961-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, Raymond Dean lived there.

10971 – 84th Street – Residence

In 1930, Fred W. Lench lived there. In 1957, Edward Love (20 May 1910 Edmonton – 11 Jun 1984 Edmonton), city employee, lived there with his wife Anna Julia (Storvig) Love (1912-2003) and their son (Edward) Ross Love (b. 19 Feb 1951 – d. 2 May 1979 – heart attack – Edmonton). The same family was living there in 1963. Ross had a sibling. Also in 1963, Stewart Wood and his wife were living at the same address along with Oliver Olsen, retired.

10975-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, Gilbert Shore lived there. In 1957, the following were living there: Gilbert Shore, retired, Mrs. Gilbert Shore, and Walter Shore, clerk. In 1963, the following were living there: Gilbert Shore, retired, Alvina Shore, and Walter Shore, clerk.

10979-84th Street – Residence

In 1930, John Brittan was living there. In 1957, the following were living there: Stan Hinchey, retired, and Mrs. Stan Hinchey. In 1963, the following were living there: Robert Hinchey retired and Jennie Hinchey.

11015-84th Street – Residence

This was a two-storey structure and included a finished basement. In 1957, the following were recorded as living there: John Unger (crane operator), his wife Alice Unger, Mrs. Myrtle Rober, Woodward employee, and Mr. and Mrs. Wesley Smith, welder. John and Alice had three sons. John ran the Cromdale Community League on 82nd Street, just south of the Kinnaird Ravine. In 1963, the following are recorded as living there: John Unger, crane operator, Alice Unger, Ray Unger, student, Henry Unger, disabled, Rudolf Olsen, carpenter, and Florence Olsen. Evelyn Unger, the founder of the Evelyn Unger School for autistic children was a sister-in-law of John Unger.

11029-84th Street – Residence.

This house was built in 1948 by James Andrew (Jim) Walker. Jim was born in Edmonton in 1920 and died in Edmonton 1980. Jim's father was born in Centralia, Huron County, Ontario. Jim married Hilda in 1944 in Manchester, England. Hilda was a war bride. They had three children and were still living at that house in 1963 (as per the voters list for that year). Jim worked as a driver for Muttart's. Jim had a brother named William who lived in Sherwood Park. Hilda died in 2011 in Edmonton.

11033-84th Street – Residence

In 1957, the following were recorded as voters living there: E. G. Ferguson, retired, Mrs. E. G. Ferguson, Wayne Ferguson, welder, Hugh Hutton, motor mechanic, Jean Hutton. The Huttons were from Scotland and had two sons and a daughter. Their first son was born in 1951. The Huttons moved at some point subsequent to the fall of 1958 to Jasper Place. The Huttons must have rented in this home. In 1963 the following are recorded as voters at this address: William Hague, officer, Mrs. Olive Hague, Donald Hague, nurse, Mrs. J. K. Security Officer.

11041-84th Street – Residence

This house was at the corner of 84th Street and 111 Avenue. In 1957, the following were living there and recorded as voters: Mr. and Mrs. Albert Ciz, administrator, John Ciz, janitor, Henry Panych, bodyman, Andrew Sebdza, accountant, and Peter Sebdza, student. The following were recorded as living there in 1963: Mike Rurka, post office, Mike Rurka's wife Emily, John Ciz, janitor, Ray Thiessen, Hook Signs, and Helen Vitek, office worker. Many of these were likely renters. It was a fairly large house, although only one-storey.

110th Avenue

8220-110th Avenue – Residence

In 1957, John Macaulay, personnel officer, Mrs. John Macaulay, and Mr. B. Orr, insurance underwriter were living there. In 1963, the following were living there: John Macaulay, telephone, and Mrs. Victoria Macaulay, secretary.

8304-110th Avenue – Residence

In 1963, the following were living there: Raymond Boudreau, R.C.A.F. and Arlene Boudreau were living there.

8308-110th Avenue – Residence

In 1957, the following were living there: Mrs. Nellie Harris, Raleigh Thorsen, shipper, and Mrs. Raleigh Thorsen. In 1963, the following were living there: Bob Houben, cabinet maker, Mrs. Johanna Houben, and John Stoter, baker.

8312-1110th Avenue – Residence

Mrs. Marion Hunt lived there in 1957.

8314-110th Avenue – Residence

In 1957, Mr Bruce Pettet, salesman, Mrs. Bruce Pettet, and Mrs. J. P. Shore, widow, lived there.

111th Avenue

Note: Prior to 1914, 111th Avenue between 82nd and 84th Street was known as Shand Avenue.

7711-111th Avenue – Residence

This is just across the street from the ravine. There used to be a medical doctor living there.

7835-111th Avenue – Residence

Sampson Henry Muttart was born in 1876 in Prince Edward Island. His father was George Stephen Muttart (1840-) and his mother was Melinda Wadman (1846-). Three of his six children were: Aiden Muttart (1902-), Merrill Muttart and Edna Ethel Muttart (1902-1975). Merrill married Gladys Bowling. Edna was married Boyd C. Louther (born 24 February 1895 in PEI and died – 7 May 1979, Edmonton). Sampson's wife's full name was Lydia Alma Davis and she was born in 1875 in L'Anse Au Cousi, Gaspé, Quebec. Sampson Muttart and Alma Davis were married on 25 July 1900 in the Methodist Church in Gaspé, Quebec.

Sampson Muttart moved to Edmonton to go into business with his brother Benjamin Stewart Muttart in house construction. He started the Muttart Lumber Yard along 84th Street. Sampson and his family moved into the house in Viewpoint in 1931.

7847-111th Avenue – Residence

This structure is located on Viewpoint. Alexander Entwistle, a theatre impresario of some note was born in about 1865 in Darwin, Lancashire, England and arrived in Edmonton in 1905. Note: he lived from 1920 to 1922 at 11028-83rd Street. He came eventually however to live at this address on 111th Avenue.

8112-111th Avenue – Public Park

This is the Sheriff Robertson Park in 2012. This was the location of the Cromdale Community League Building at one time. The community league building burnt down, date unknown.

8232-111th Avenue – Residence

This was a two-storey house. In 1957, Albert Gibbons, machinist, lived in this house with his wife and son Robert, who at that time was a city employee. In 1963, the same family lived there although Robert was recorded as an engineer. Robert used to have a light blue convertible sports car. He had built a ramp for the car on the east side of the house as the house backed onto the ravine. Albert Gibbons used to polish stones as a hobby.

8234-111th Avenue – Residence

This was a two-storey house. No voters were recorded as living there in 1957. This structure had a veranda in front. In 1963, Kenneth Harrison, truck driver, was living there with his wife Anna and a Leone Harrison (likely Kenneth's mother), retired. Kenneth and Anna had three children – the oldest of which would have been born in the mid-fifties. This house backed on Kinnaird Ravine.

8302-111th Avenue – Residence

This house had an enclosed porch. It came to have a greenhouse beside it. It was painted white. It backed on the Kinnaird Ravine. In 1923, it was occupied by Percy I. Moore. In 1957, it was inhabited by Carmond Wood, salesman, and his wife. Carmond Wood was born in 1901 in Ontario. His parents were Wilburn Wood and Matilda Wood. In 1963, it was inhabited by Walter Scramstead, meter reader, and his wife Gladys Scramstead. There is a record that indicates a Walter Scramstead was born in 1913 in Alberta.

8312-111th Avenue – Residence

This was a two-story residence. From 1923 to 1927, the occupant is listed as David T. Bell, auto mechanic. He was born in 1888 in Wentworth, Ontario, the son of Thomas Bell (1856-1908) and Sarah Jane Brown (1855-1942). He was married to Sophia Nicholson. At one time, Sophia Nicholson was voted in as a school board trustee. David and Sophia had a daughter named Virginia, who married a policeman named Thomas Botsford and came to live in the same house after her marriage. In 1930, Thomas Botsford was living at this address and working as a driver. Thomas Savella Botsford was born on 18 March 1912 in Edmonton and died on 30 March 1974 in Victoria, British Columbia. His parents were from Leeds County in Ontario and were named Frederick J. Botsford and Adamina Young. Frederick J. Botsford was born in June 1885 in Ontario and Adamina Young was born on 3 December 1887. Adamina (Minnie) Young died in 1957 in Edmonton. Frederick J. Botsford lived at 10722-95th Street in Edmonton. Thomas and Virginia had three kids. Thomas Savella Botsford was a military policeman during the Second World War. As of 1957, the following were living at the address: Mrs. S. N. Bell (widow), Thomas and Virginia (Bell) Botsford. As of 1963, the following were living there: Thomas and Virginia Botsford

and their son Fred, who was their oldest child. A blog that pertains in part to Sophia Nicholson can be found at: <http://flointhecity-aworkinprogress.blogspot.ca/2011/03/im-watching-jules-et-jim-on-turner.html> Thomas Botsford's brother was Frederick Gordon Botsford who was the Principal at Highlands Junior High. Patsy Mackay, who lived across the street, has a memory of seeing Sophia Nicholson Bell up on the roof of the house doing repairs. This would have taken place at some point in the early 1950s.

112th Avenue (east of CNR Tracks to 76th Street)

Note: In the 1916 Henderson's Edmonton Directory (p. 226) it divides 112th Avenue into sections. 112th Avenue "Formerly Knox Ave. from 50th Street to 78th St.; Pine Ave. from 78th St. to 121st St. and Nipigon Ave. from 121st St. west."

Note: The Cromdale School schoolyard extends from 79th Street to 80th Street along the north side of 112th Avenue, thus there are no houses there. Also, the Stutchbury Park extends along the south side of 112th Avenue from 76th Street to roughly 78th Street thus no houses along the south side of 112th Avenue there. Borden Park extends from 76th Street beginning east of there all the way to 78th Street, thus no houses on the north side of 112th Avenue along there.

7802-112th Avenue - Residence

In 1930, James Robertson lived here. In 1966, Mrs. G. Buschkiel lived here. She had a son who was attending Cromdale Elementary School in 1962/63.

7901-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1966, Boleslaw Grabczewski lived here.

7907-112th Avenue – Residence

Mrs. Helen Hertzberg lived there.

7910-112th Avenue – Health Centre

The East Edmonton Health Centre is located here in 2012. It opened in 2010.

7911-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, John Hougan lived here. In 1966, Nick Kotlyak lived there.

7917-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1966, Richard Edmond lived there,

7926-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, Christopher Atkin Jr. lived here.

7928-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, Chris Atkin lived here.

7931-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, William Reitt lived here.

7932-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, H. Edward Kinsey lived here.

8002-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1966, Mr. Robert Atkin was living there.

8006-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1966, John Stecyk lived here.

8010-112th Avenue – Residence

Chokan Stephan lived there in 1966.

8011-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, Frederick Chatters lived there.

8014-112th Avenue – Residence and Business

Sven Jacobsen lived here in 1966 and ran a business out of his house called Jacobsen Concrete Limited.

8022-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1966, Marino Venuti lived here.

8028-112th Avenue – Residence

John Haylock lived here in 1966.

8025-112th Avenue – Apartment Building

This structure has three storeys.

8102-112th Avenue – Residence

Mike Lyzanchuk lived here in 1966.

8105-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1930, W. Montgomery lived here. John Markus lived here in 1966.

8106-112th Avenue – Residence

Joseph Zvonkovich lived here in 1966.

8108-112th Avenue – Residence

In 1966, John Bowie lived there.

At one time, the city zoo was located at Borden Park.

Howard Stutchbury Park

This park extends from 76th Street to roughly 78th Street on the south side of 112th Avenue. There is a memorial at one end that is dedicated to Howard Stutchbury. This memorial was erected in 1960. Howard Stutchbury helped found the Edmonton musical festival and in 1946 founded the Alberta Safety Council.

Jane Salisbury Park

This is located at 77th Street behind the houses on 112th Avenue South.

Jasper Avenue (East of 84th Street)

7696-Jasper Avenue – Residence

This structure was built around 1912. One of its early owners was Captain John Hall, a First World War veteran, was director of the Soldier Settlement Board and was the first superintendent of the province wide government liquor vending operation in the 1920s. His daughter, Mary, was a teacher at Cromdale School for many years. She taught there until at least 1958. In 1930, Captain John Hall lived in this house. In 1953, Frank Vries lived here. In 2012, this house is owned by the City of Edmonton and rented out.

He was 67 years of age. Mr. McLuhan was born at Conn, Ontario and came west in 1905. He settled first in the Vermillion district and later moved to Wainwright, where he remained for a period before coming to Edmonton to enter the real estate business. He served for four years overseas during the First Great War with 202nd. Battalion and on returning to Edmonton in 1919 was employed as an

appraisal agent with the Soldier Settlement Board. In 1921, he re-entered the real estate business with the H.S. Hegler firm and later joined Magee and McRae Ltd. He was well known throughout Edmonton and northern Alberta as a sportsman. Surviving are his widow, two daughters, Margaret and Betty, and one son, William John, all at home; two sisters, Mrs. O.J. Stevenson, Guelph, Ontario, and Lieut. Marion McLuhan, C.W.A.C., Winnipeg, and two brothers, Stanley, Castor, Alberta, and Tracy, Regina, Saskatchewan."

Blanche continued living there with her single daughter Betty (1924-2011) for many years after Llewellyn's death. In 1953, Mrs. B. McLuhan was recorded as living there. They eventually moved into a high rise condominium complex in west downtown with a view of the river valley. Blanche Jackson was born in 1893 in England and died in 1989 in Edmonton.

Kathleen Rutledge had two children at least who both attended Cromdale School. In 1930 and 1953, Robert S. Robertson was listed as living there. In 1953, the following were also living here: Allan Champion and Mrs. Kathleen Rutledge.

7826-Jasper Avenue – Residence

In 1930, Julius Lentz lived here. Julius Martin Lentz was born in 1888 in the Ukraine and died in 1951 in Edmonton. In 1953, Mrs. Dorcy Lentz was living here.

Clarke studied law at York University in Toronto. He moved to the Yukon after graduation and was admitted to the bar there. He moved to Edmonton to practice law in 1908. He married Gwendolyn Asbury in Edmonton on 9 October 1911. They had three children. He served twice as mayor of Edmonton. Gwendolen (Asbury) Clarke was elected alder person in 1941 following her husband's death. She was the third woman in Edmonton's history to be elected to civic office. Gwendolyn was born in 1883 and died in 1972. In 1953, Gwendolyn Clarke lived in this house.

7860-Jasper Avenue – Residence

In 1953, Mrs. Florence Pavey lived here.

7866-Jasper Avenue – Residence

In 1930, Kenneth A. Blatchford was recorded as living here. This two-storey house was built in 1919 when the Blatchford family moved in. Kenneth Alexander Blatchford was born in Minnesoda, Manitoba 5 March 1882 to Scottish-Canadian parents. He arrived in Edmonton in the 1890s and married Grace Lauder Walker in 1904. He served as mayor of Edmonton between 1924 and 1926 and was elected as a

Member of Parliament in 1926 for Edmonton East. He died in 1931. Grace Lauder Walker was born in 1884 in Edmonton. Her maternal grandfather was James Lauder, a prominent local politician and businessman, for whom the Lauderdale community is named. In 1953, D. Kenneth Lewis lived here. In 1969, extensive renovations were made to the home under new ownership.

7870-Jasper Avenue – Residence

8228-Jasper Avenue – Residence

In 1957, Nettie Lammie, who was retired, Clifford Shields, clerk, and Elaine Shields lived there. The same three people were living there in 1963.

8300-Jasper Avenue – Low-rise Apartment Building

In 1963, this is recorded as a 6 unit apartment building. The following were living there in 1963: Anthony Thibudeau, manager, G. O. Sinclair, manager, Franks Smith, manager, Mrs. Frank Smith, Cecil Phales, bar manager, Murray Dupre, and Mary Dupre, secretary.

8304-Jasper Avenue – Residence

In 1930, Peter F. McClary lived here. Peter Frank McClary was born in 1879 in Middlesex County, Ontario. He moved to Edmonton from Ontario around 1906. He died in 1931 in Edmonton. He ran a hardware business in Edmonton. He was married to Bertha Louise Bradford (1878-1964).

In 1957, the following were living there: Allen Smith, trucker, Mrs. Allen Smith, Robert Kerr, salesman, Mrs. Robert Kerr, and M. Huot, trucker. There is no entry for this address in the 1963 voters list for the area.

8306-Jasper Avenue – Condominium Complex
