

## Mackay 1918 Isabelle Mackay marries Frederick George Mitchell

The following is taken From the Woodstock *Sentinel Review* for 17 June, 1918:

"London- A wedding of much interest is that which took place on Saturday afternoon at St. Andrews Church when Isabelle, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Hugh S. Mackay of Woodstock was united in marriage to Utilities Commissioner F.G. Mitchell of this city. Reverend Dr. MacGregor officiated. The Church was beautiful with floral decorations and greenery. The Bride entered the Church to the strains of Lohengrins Wedding March in a navy-blue tailored suit with sand trimmings attended by Mrs. L.A. Burnett of Toronto. His son, J.C. Mitchell, of Walkersville, supported the groom. During the ceremony, Charles F. Wheeler played wedding music and at the signing of the register, Mrs. Anna Cockrill sang 'The Gardens of Your Heart` by Francis Dorel. A dainty wedding breakfast at which out-of-town guests from Vancouver, Winnipeg and Toronto were present, was served at Tecumseh house after which the bridal party left on a motor trip to Atlantic City, Washington, Baltimore, New York, New York and other western points. On their return they will be residing at Earlton Place, 618 Wellington Street this city and will be at home to visitors after 1 September."
